BRAZILIAN ECO-LODGES TEAM UP FOR NEW TOUR

Three boutique Brazilian luxury lodges are offering a conservation-focused itinerary, where guests can spot maned wolves, white-whiskered spider monkeys and jaguars.

TTG - Luxury travel news - Brazilian eco-lodges team up for new tour

The Brazil's Big Three – Ultimate Wildlife Experience tour launched in September and has been created with conservation tourism organisation The Long Run, Brazilian non-profit the Oncafari Association and UK marketing and PR specialist Senderos.

It starts at the Pousada Trijuncao in the Cerrado savannah, where guests track maned wolves with the Oncafari team, visit a rewilding farm and try safari cycling and kayaking.

Guests then head to Cristalino Lodge in the southern Amazon rainforest, which is only accessible by boat. They will sail up a private stretch of the Cristalino River, attempting to spot endemic white-whiskered spider monkeys. Activities include guided rainforest trails, spotting native birds and animals, boat trips and kayaking.

The final destination is Caiman's Casa Caiman, which offers the chance to track jaguars in the wild with Oncafari, join a horse riding tour and observe blue hyacinth macaw conservation work.

The tour is available year-round and can be booked through operators including Audley Travel, Journey Latin America, Latin Routes, Distinctive Americas and World Odyssey.

Let me bring a different angle to this matter. As small businesses, we're making a tremendous effort to refrain the environmental crash Brazil is currently facing. Together, the 3 lodges, protects more than 95,000 hectares of stunning - and endangered - Brazilian Biomes. One of our main challenges is to prove to neighbouring properties that it is possible to extract value from the preserved land, through tourism,

rather than cutting down the forest and dedicating the area to the rapidly expanding agribusiness. When you promote these lodges and book them, you're not contributing to Bolsonaro's "economic" endeavour - it's quite the opposite, really. You're fueling conservation efforts which are trying to escalate the global awareness of these biomes and prove that it's possible to generate revenue whilst keeping all its biodiversity untouched. I'd love to show you more of our conservation ef-

forts if you have time.


